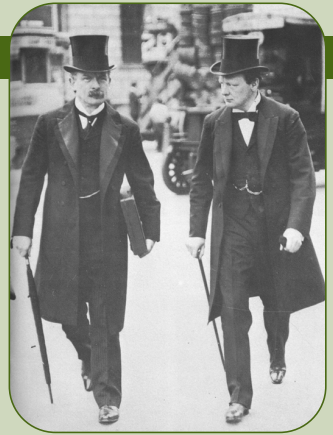
Its contents appeal to anyone with an interest in the history of British Liberalism, whether academics, party activists or spare-time students of political history.

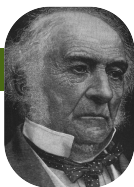

The Journal of Liberal History is published by the Liberal Democrat History Group, established in 1988 to promote the discussion and research of historical topics relating to the histories of the Liberal Democrats, Liberal Party, the SDP and of liberalism.

In addition to publishing the *The Journal of Liberal History*, the History Group:

- Publishes books, including the *Dictionary of Liberal Biography*, the *Dictionary of Liberal Quotations* and *Great Liberal Speeches*.
- Organises evening discussions meetings and witness seminars. Holds fringe meetings at Liberal Democrat conferences. Speakers include academics and leading figures from the Liberal Democrats and other parties.
- Maintains **www.liberalhistory.org.uk**, the web's premier site for all aspects of British Liberal history. This includes records of all past *Journals* (plus complete downloadable files of the first 20 issues), guides to archive sources, research in progress and other resources for students of Liberal history.
- Is developing the 'Liberal History Online' project, at **www.liberalhistory.org.uk**, containing a concise history of the party, a growing series of pages covering particular issues and periods in more detail, and research resources, including lists of party leaders, election results and cabinet ministers.
